DETECTIVES RELEASE CCTV STILL OF MISSING WOMAN

Detectives investigating the disappearance of an Ipswich woman are releasing a CCTV image – to help bring in more information.

Tania Nicol, aged 19, was last seen at about 10:30pm on Monday, October 30, 2006, when she left her home in Woolverstone Close, Ipswich, to spend the night working as a prostitute in town.

The image shows Tania close to the exit of the Sainsbury's garage, on London Road, as she walks in the direction of the town centre.

It is timed at 11:02pm on October 30, 2006.

Detective Chief Inspector John Quinton, who is leading the investigation into Tania's disappearance, said:

“Officers on the enquiry have spent many hours studying CCTV footage – and with the help of Tania's family, we have been able to establish that this image is of Tania.

“Finding this image is important as we now have a definite indication of where Tania was and when on the night she went missing.

“I hope that, by releasing this image, it might jog the memories of people who were in the area at the time and prompt them to come forward with any information they might have.”

“Tania was wearing quite distinctive clothing, particularly her pink shoes, and there would have been people in the area at that night, either driving past or using the petrol station nearby.”

Tania is described as having an olive complexion, is about 5ft 2ins tall, of slim build, with shoulder length light brown hair, brown eyes and a spotty complexion.

She was last seen wearing a light-coloured top, mid-blue cut-off jeans and pink high-heeled shoes.
