Bribery & Corruption

The Bribery Act came into force on the 1st July 2011. You need to be aware of how this legislation may affect your work for the BBC.

See the BBC's Anti-Bribery Code of Conduct, Policy and Guidance. A new training module will be available shortly on learn.gateway.

The BBC faces many risks of corruption, particularly when working with third parties and in foreign territories. It is essential for us all to protect the BBC's integrity and reputation by being aware of the risks and conducting our work in a way that minimises them.

Corruption includes bribery and is the abuse of entrusted power for private gain. It can be considered to involve the offering, giving or receiving of any benefit with the intent to induce an act or decision, and by doing so assist an entity in improperly obtaining an advantage.

It is **illegal to pay a bribe** either in the UK or anywhere overseas.
