Protest as ship docks

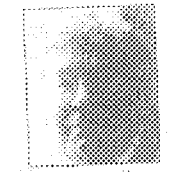
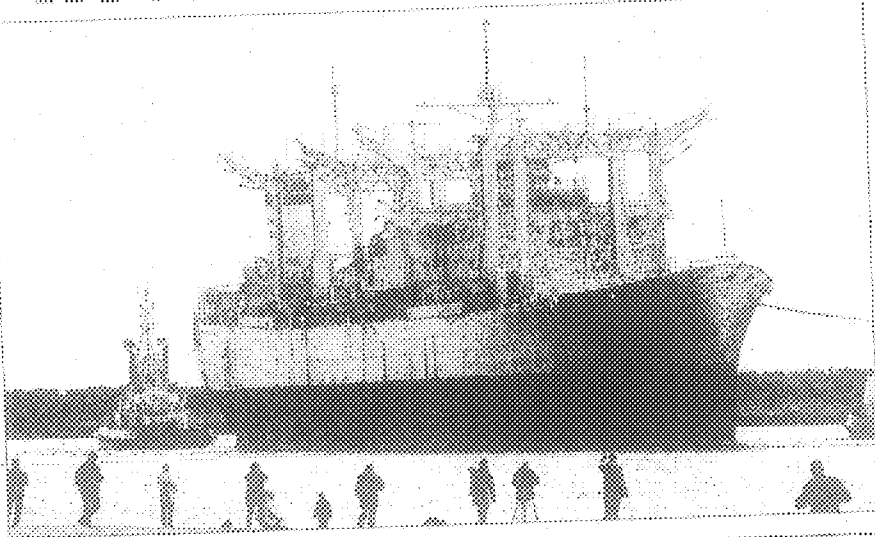
A **defiant** ghost ship docked at "Toxic Ship Dock" at the docks yesterday — to be greeted by crowds of angry environmental protesters.

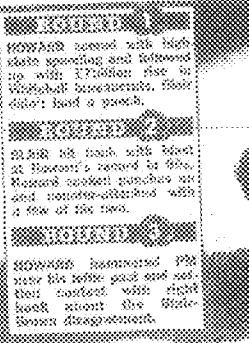
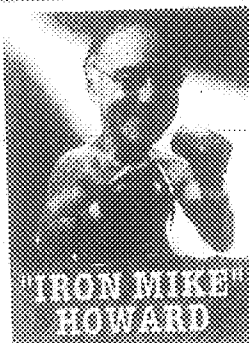
FIRST BLOOD TO IRON MIKE
