The necessity of your having to be 'involved' and the 'very strong legal advice' apparently given to Mr Hunt suggests that you had concerns about Mr Hunt's contacts with News Corporation even before the Prime Minister transferred responsibility for the bid to DCMS (in December 2010). Did you think it was appropriate for Mr Hunt to take responsibility for this quasi-judicial decision, and if not, did you raise your concerns with anyone?

Finally, in view of the fact that this was a quasi-judicial decision, why did you think it was appropriate for Mr Hunt's Special Adviser, his political appointee, to act as a contact point with News Corporation?
