columnist and transatlantic columnist and transatlantic intellectual, does not normally crop 1. up in a comedy gig. Tim Minchin' desire to mix high-flownideas with populist rock anthems means that you can just about forgive him for joining the arena set.
Stadim gigs may be an abomination butthe Australian singer-stand-up certainly had enough personality to fill the vacuum in Brighton's bland megavenue (a mere village hall, it must be said, compared with the 02 Arena). That Minchin, shock-haired and barefoot, is on the road at the same time His songs for the RSC's adal of Matllda are being given their pemiere in Stratford is the mark of a periomer who has energy to spare. While he may claim to be stressed, and overeating as a result he still has the bounce and enthusiasm of the eternal modergrad rather than a 35 -year old father-of-two.
In fact you cannot help wishing he would hold back on the music, slow the tempo and spend slightly more time delivering conventional stand-upThere's no denying the vigour of the wordplay in his new songs, yet over the course of a couple of hours the sof rock melodies grow repetitive and 2verbearing: by the end you begin to ell as if an antipodean Victoria Wood $s$ beating you about the head witha hesaurus. Minchin is a spinted pianist. ut even with the Heritage Orchestra Jayers and the conductor Jules buckley by his side, he lacks Bill Bailey's ght touch.
Fans probably won't be disappointed, hough, especially as Minchin launches moceedings with an ingeniously ver-the-iop number that parodies the heatrics of all those superstars who rallow in self-pity while fleecing their udiences Later he embarks on a Mat captures the mixed arent wro longs for a moment's peace nd cuie Shades of Roald Dahl here The more phlosophical passages are mived bunch. ## Cynical Santa is soft on the inside

nthony Neilson's last play here was an unforgettably unnerving drami incired the Josef Eritz case So is by Scottish writer and director really the man to entrust with the Courts first famify Christmas show, for ages 7 and up?
Oh yes he is. Sure Santa is tred and tetchy, an evil teddy bear cons a litie girl and mankind is doomed to relive Christmas Day forever. But if you can buy into the slightly Rentaghost
buy into the shohty Rentaghost
sensiblity this beautully unlikely play
has heart to maich its humeur. And it summons up that frazzled festive feeling as vividly as being dipped in cranberry sauce then rolled in It
It looks like a big pink Chrismas present Miriam Buether s set comes wrapped in a bow, behind which is the Finnegan family's living room, entirely ordinary bar its garish colour scheme. "Christons is rubbish" grumps ten-year-old Holly, played with petulant appeal by the grown-up Imogen Doel. Holly is angry with Santa Every year,
she tells us, she asks him to find her real father Every year he ignores her. She's got a stepdad, Bernard. But he's a dog, who decorates the Christmas tree with bacon and stuffs a plastic bag in his. pocket each time he takes himself for a walk Shell capture Santa, if needs to be, to findher dad.
Neilson brings the magic of a wild Christmas yarn into the domestic arena. We get spectacle-Santa's silly son
Bumblehole played with perfectiy Bumblehole played with perfectly phaned naivety by fom Godwn, flies down from his sleigh through a skylight We get puppetry - a spell from Santa's magic beard means that Holly's teddy is Walking and talking and claiming, in a Russian accent, to be her dad, cursed by a gypsy to live forever in "this fluffy tomb". Teddy is voiced with nyahahaha! relish by Chand Martinez. And we get songs by Nick Powell (who co-devised the story) that the cast break into to celebrate or denigrate the festive season. Nelson does a lot of his writing in retearsal, and sure enough his producion is a bit rough round the edges. But the emotional underbelly is there to keep it all grounded. Both Holly and Bumblehole need their fathers' approval. And their neediness gives rise to some fine jokes, accessible to all ages, and a nice little Blade Rumner reference for them as wants it
Neilson's surprising, irreverent story ends with a warming message that the real gitiof Christmas is to be thankful for what you've already got. Sure, he punctures his ow homily just like he punctures everything else. But the conclusion is moving and optimistic Inside some cynical wrapping, this is the most properly Christmassy show of the season.
