

PCC announces new appointment

Jonathan Collett has been appointed to a new position of Director of Communications at The Press Complaints Commission.

He takes up his position on 23rd November and will develop and direct communications strategy for the PCC and promote the press regulatory system to politicians, opinion formers and the general public.

Commenting on the appointment, Baroness Buscombe, Chairman of the PCC said:

"Jonathan brings with him substantial experience in public relations, political communications and media handling. I am very pleased that he has decided to join us and he will significantly strengthen our team.
