

PCC publishes three adjudications

It has rejected a complaint from a figure in the animal rights movement that an article in the Evening Standard was inaccurate in breach of Clause 1 (Accuracy) of the Code. The Commission, taking into consideration the evidence supplied by the newspaper, considered that its subsequent offer to publish a letter from the complainant represented a sufficient response to the complaint under the Code. The Commission has rejected complaints made by a man against the People under Clause 1 and 2 (Opportunity to reply) and a woman against the MK News under Clauses 3 (Privacy) and 9 (Reporting of crime) of the Code. To read the adjudications [click here](#) and [here](#) respectively.
